
Manual seat



- Seat position fore/aft adjustment lever
- Seatback angle adjustment lever
- Vertical height adjustment lever (driver's side only)

Pull up the lever until the lock is completely released.


Active head restraints



When the occupant's lower back presses against the seatback during a rear-end collision, the head restraint moves slightly forward and upward to help reduce the risk of whiplash on the seat occupant.

n Active head restraints


Even small forces applied to the seatback may cause the head restraint to move. Pushing up a locked head restraint forcibly may make the inner structure of the head restraint appear. This does not indicate a problem.



n Seat adjustment

- 1 Be careful that the seat does not hit passengers or luggage.
- Do not recline the seat more than necessary when the vehicle is in motion to reduce the risk of sliding under the lap belt.
 If the seat is too reclined, during an accident the lap belt may slide past the hips and apply restraint forces directly to the abdomen or your neck may contact the shoulder belt, increasing the risk of death or serious injury.
- 1 Manual seat only: After adjusting the seat, make sure that the seat is locked in position.

1-3. Adjustable components (seats, mirrors, steering wheel) Rear seats




Seatback angle adjustment lever


Pull up the lever until the lock is completely released.

Folding down the rear seatbacks

n Before folding down the rear seatbacks



Stow the seat belt buckles and lower the head restraints to the lowest position.




Pass the outer seat belts and plates through the seat belt hangers.

This prevents the shoulder belt from being damaged.


Make sure that the seat belts are removed from the hangers before using them.


- n Folding down the rear seatbacks
- From inside



Fold down the seatback while pulling the seatback angle adjustment lever.

Pull up the lever until the lock is completely released.





Pull the lever.

- For left side rear seatback
- For right side and center rear seatback

n Seat adjustment

Do not recline the seat more than necessary when the vehicle is in motion, to reduce the risk of sliding under the lap belt. If the seat is too reclined, the lap belt may slide past the hips and apply restraint forces directly to the abdomen or your neck may contact the shoulder belt, increasing the risk of death or serious injury in the event of an accident.

n Before folding down a rear seat

Do not fold down a rear seat when there are passengers sitting in the rear seats or when there is luggage placed on the rear seats.

n When returning the seatbacks to their original position

Observe the following precautions. Failure to do so may result in death or serious injury.

- 1 Be careful not to get your hands pinched in the seat.
- 1 Make sure the seatbacks are securely locked by lightly rocking it back and forth.
- 1 Check that the seat belts are not twisted or caught under the seat.
- 1 Arrange the seat belts in the proper positions for ready use.



n When folding down the rear seatbacks

The seat belts and buckles must be stowed.

Head restraints are provided for all seats.



n Adjusting the height of the head restraints




Make sure that the head restraints are adjusted so that the center of the head restraint is closest to the top of your ears.

n Adjusting the rear center seat head restraint


Always raise the head restraint one level from the stowed position when using.

n Removing the head restraints



Pull the head restraint up while pressing the lock release button.

n Installing the head restraints



Align the head restraint with the installation holes and push it down to the lock position.

Press and hold the lock release button when lowering the head restraint.

n Head restraint precautions


Observe the following precautions regarding the head restraints. Failure to do so may result in death or serious injury.

- 1 Use the head restraints designed for each respective seat.
- 1 Adjust the head restraints to the correct position at all times.
- 1 After adjusting the head restraints, push down on them and make sure they are locked in position.
- 1 Do not drive with the head restraints removed.

1-3. Adjustable components (seats, mirrors, steering wheel) Seat belts


Make sure that all occupants are wearing their seat belts before driving the vehicle.

n Correct use of the seat belts



- Extend the shoulder belt so that it comes fully over the shoulder, but does not come into contact with the neck or slide off the shoulder.
- Position the lap belt as low as possible over the hips.
- Adjust the position of the seatback. Sit up straight and well back in the seat.
- 4 Do not twist the seat belt.

n Fastening and releasing the seat belt




1 Fastening the belt

Push the tab into the buckle until a clicking sound is heard.

2 Releasing the belt

Press the release button.


n Adjusting the height of the belt (front seats)



- 1 Down
- 2 Up

Move the height adjuster up and down as needed until you hear a click.

Seat belt pretensioners (front seats)



The pretensioner helps the seat belt to quickly restrain the occupant by retracting the seat belt when the vehicle is subjected to certain types of severe frontal collision.

The pretensioner may not activate in the event of a minor frontal impact, a side impact or a rear impact.

n Emergency locking retractor (ELR)

The retractor will lock the belt during a sudden stop or on impact. It may also lock if you lean forward too quickly. A slow, easy motion will allow the belt to extend, and you can move around fully.

n Automatic locking retractor (ALR)

When a passenger's shoulder belt is completely extended and then retracted even slightly, the belt is locked in that position and cannot be extended. This feature is used to hold the child restraint system (CRS) firmly. To free the belt again, fully retract the belt and then pull the belt out once more. (\rightarrow P. 136)

n Pregnant women


Obtain medical advice and wear the seat belt in the proper way. (\rightarrow P. 77)

Women who are pregnant should position the lap belt as low as possible over the hips in the same manner as other occupants. Extend the shoulder belt completely over the shoulder and position the belt across the chest. Avoid belt contact over the rounding of the abdominal area.

If the seat belt is not worn properly, not only a pregnant woman, but also the fetus could suffer death or serious injury as a result of sudden braking or a collision.

n People suffering illness

Obtain medical advice and wear the seat belt in the proper way. (\rightarrow P. 77)



${\rm n}\,$ When not using the rear outboard seat belts



Pass the outer seat belts and plates through the seat belt hangers to prevent the shoulder belts from being damaged.

n Child seat belt usage


The seat belts of your vehicle were principally designed for persons of adult size.

- 1 Use a child restraint system appropriately for the child, until the child becomes large enough to properly wear the vehicle's seat belt. (\rightarrow P. 130)
- 1 When the child becomes large enough to properly wear the vehicle's seat belt, follow the instructions on P. 77 regarding seat belt usage.

n Replacing the belt after the pretensioner has been activated

If the vehicle is involved in multiple collisions, the pretensioner will activate for the first collision, but will not activate for the second or subsequent collisions.

n Seat belt extender



If your seat belts cannot be fastened securely because they are not long enough, a personalized seat belt extender is available from your Toyota dealer free of charge.

Observe the following precautions to reduce the risk of injury in the event of sudden braking or an accident.

Failing to do so may cause death or serious injury.

n Wearing a seat belt

- 1 Ensure that all passengers wear a seat belt.
- 1 Always wear a seat belt properly.
- 1 Each seat belt should be used by one person only. Do not use a seat belt for more than one person at the same time, including children.
- 1 Toyota recommends that children should be seated in the rear seat and always use a seat belt and/or an appropriate child restraint system.
- 1 Do not recline the seat any more than necessary to achieve a proper seating position. The seat belt is most effective when the occupants are sitting up straight and well back in the seats.
- 1 Do not wear the shoulder belt under your arm.
- 1 Always wear your seat belt low and snug across your hips.

n Adjustable shoulder anchor

Always make sure the shoulder belt is positioned across the center of your shoulder. The belt should be kept away from your neck, but not falling off your shoulder. Failure to do so could reduce the amount of protection in an accident and cause death or serious injuries in a collision. (\rightarrow P. 78)

n Seat belt pretensioners

- 1 Do not place anything, such as a cushion, on the front passenger's seat. Doing so will disperse the passenger's weight, which prevents the sensor from detecting the passenger's weight properly. As a result, the seat belt pretensioner for the front passenger's seat may not activate in the event of a collision.
- 1 If the pretensioner has activated, the seat belt becomes locked: it cannot be further extended, nor will it return to the stowed position. The seat belt cannot be used again and must be replaced at your Toyota dealer.

n Child restraint lock function belt precaution

Do not allow children to play with the child restraint lock function belt. If the belt becomes twisted around a child's neck, it will not be possible to pull the belt out leading to choking or other serious injuries that could result in death.

If this occurs and the buckle cannot be unfastened, scissors should be used to cut the belt.

n Seat belt damage and wear

- 1 Do not damage the seat belts by allowing the belt, plate or buckle to be jammed in the door.
- Inspect the seat belt system periodically. Check for cuts, fraying, and loose parts. Do not use a damaged seat belt until it is replaced. Damaged seat belts cannot protect an occupant from death or serious injury.
- 1 Ensure that the belt and tab are locked and the belt is not twisted. If the seat belt does not function correctly, immediately contact your Toyota dealer.
- 1 Replace the seat assembly, including the belts, if your vehicle has been involved in a serious accident, even if there is no obvious damage.
- Do not attempt to install, remove, modify, disassemble or dispose of a seat belt. Have any necessary repairs carried out by your Toyota dealer. Inappropriate handling of the pretensioner may cause it to activate or operate improperly and may cause death or serious injury.

n Using a seat belt extender

- 1 Do not wear the seat belt extender, if you can fasten the seat belt without the extender.
- 1 Do not use the seat belt extender when installing a child restraint system, because the belt will not securely hold the child restraint system, increasing the risk of death or serious injury in the event of an accident.
- 1 The personalized extender may not be safe on another vehicle, when used by another person, or at a different seating position other than the one originally intended.


n When using a seat belt extender

When releasing the seat belt, press on the buckle release button on the extender, not on the seat belt.


This helps prevent damage to the vehicle interior and the extender itself.

1-3. Adjustable components (seats, mirrors, steering wheel) **Steering wheel**

The steering wheel can be adjusted to a comfortable position.



Hold the steering wheel and press the lever down.



Adjust to the ideal position by moving the steering wheel horizontally and vertically.

After adjustment, pull the lever up to secure the steering wheel.

n While driving

Do not adjust the steering wheel.

Doing so may cause the driver to mishandle the vehicle and an accident, resulting in death or serious injury.

n After adjusting the steering wheel

Make sure that the steering wheel is securely locked.


Otherwise, the steering wheel may move suddenly, possibly causing an accident and resulting in death or serious injury.

1-3. Adjustable components (seats, mirrors, steering wheel) Inside rear view mirror

Glare from the headlights of vehicles behind can be reduced by using the following functions.

► Auto anti-glare inside rear view mirror

In auto mode, sensors are used to detect the headlights of vehicles behind and automatically reduce the reflected light.



Turns auto mode on/off.


The indicator comes on when auto mode is turned on.

Vehicles with smart key system:


The mirror will revert to the automatic mode each time the "ENGINE START STOP" switch is turned to IGNITION ON mode.

Vehicles without smart key system:

The mirror will revert to the automatic mode each time the engine switch is turned to the "ON" position.



 n To prevent sensor error (vehicles with auto anti-glare inside rear view mirror)




To ensure correct functioning of the sensors, do not touch or cover the sensors.

CAUTION

n While driving


Do not adjust the position of the mirror. Doing so may lead to mishandling of the vehicle and an accident, or resulting in death or serious injury.

1-3. Adjustable components (seats, mirrors, steering wheel) Outside rear view mirrors



Mirror angle can be adjusted using the switch.

Folding back the mirrors



Push backward to fold the mirrors.

n Mirror angle can be adjusted when

Vehicles with smart key system

The "ENGINE START STOP" switch is in ACCESSORY or IGNITION ON mode.

Vehicles without smart key system

The engine switch is in the "ACC" or "ON" position.

n When the mirrors are fogged up (vehicles with outside rear view mirror defoggers)

Turn on the rear window defogger to defog the mirrors. (\rightarrow P. 281)

n While driving

Observe the following precautions.

Failing to do so may result in losing control of the vehicle and cause an accident, resulting in death or serious injury.

- 1 Do not adjust the mirrors.
- 1 Do not drive with the mirrors folded back.
- 1 Before driving, be sure to extend mirrors and make an adjustment properly.
- n When the mirror defoggers are operating (vehicles with outside rear view mirror defoggers)

Do not touch the rear view mirror surfaces, as they can become very hot and burn you.

n If ice should jam the mirror

Do not operate the control or scrape the mirror face. Use a spray de-icer to free the mirror.
